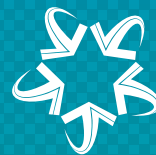

ENTRY REQUIREMENTS:

The college will assess your Maths and English levels and there will be an informal interview. If you need to boost your Maths or English, the college has a lot of courses to help you.

The course is for those working or volunteering in a school setting. This is because Cheadle College assessors would need to observe practice in a school setting as part of the qualification.

COURSE SUMMARY:

This qualification provides learners with an in-depth understanding of the knowledge and skills needed when working directly with children and young people in school and college environments. It covers all aspects of specialist support including

planning, delivering and reviewing assessment strategies to support learning alongside the teacher; bilingual support; special needs support; and personal development and reflective practice.

COURSE CONTENT:

There are 16 mandatory units:

- Schools and colleges as organisations
- Support health and safety in a learning environment
- Understand how to safeguard children and young people
- Develop professional relationships with children, young people and adults
- Understand how children and young people develop
- Support positive behaviour in children and young people
- Support children and young people during learning activities
- Support English and Maths Skills
- Support the use of ICT in the learning environment
- Support assessment for learning
- Engage in personal and professional development
- Support children and young people's speech, language and communication
- Understand how to support bilingual learners
- Understand how to support learning of children and young people with special educational needs and disabilities
- Support children and young people during transitions
- Support the role of play, leisure and extra-curricular activities for children and young people

ASSESSMENT:

All evidence will be completed by a variety of assessment methods such as professional discussions, observations, written work.

PROGRESSION:

Successful students may progress to a higher level:

- Level 4 Certificate for the Advanced Practitioner in Schools and Colleges
- Foundation Degree (FdA) in Education and Learning Support

- ✓ Aged 19 or over on 31st August 2024
